- ** These homicides were committed by two perpetrators, Leabeater and Steele. The histories of both men are counted.
- *** As some details in prior years are unknown and more mass shootings may have occurred, totals are tallied only to 1987.
- **** A history of mental illness is defined as a detectable DSM5 psychiatric illness either diagnosed, reported to authorities or in any way established prior to the shooting i.e. minimum sufficient cause to justify legal seizure of firearms.

Note: The Milperra Bikie Massacre of 1984 was not included. Although seven people were shot dead and 21 injured in the Viking Tavern carpark, only a 14 year-old girl who was killed seems to qualify as a victim, while the remaining six were members of rival gangs, i.e. perpetrators.

Summary

From January 1987 to June 2022, 15 mass shootings in Australia left 120 shot dead and 57 wounded by gunfire. All the perpetrators were men. Police files, judges' summations and coroners' reports show that:

- 51% of the victims were shot by a licensed gun owner
- 82% of the victims were shot by a killer with no previous history of violent crime
- 71% of the victims were shot by a killer with no previous history of mental illness
- 54% of the victims died in a shooting in which a military-style semi-automatic weapon was used

While 19 of the victims of mass shootings from 1987 to May 2022 (17%) were killed by men with a previously known history of mental illness, 52 out of 112 victims (46%) were shot by previously law-abiding, licensed male gun owners using legally held firearms.
